## DELEGATION FROM THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL TO PRESIDE OVER MEETINGS OF THE FEDERAL EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

UNDER the provisions of Section 126 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, and of Clause 6 of the Letters Patent constituting the office of Governor-General, dated 29th October, 1900, I hereby appoint Senator the Honourable John Joseph Daly, Vice-President of the Executive Council, to be my Deputy to summon and preside over meetings of the Executive Council, and to signify approval of the proceedings at such meetings, during my absence from the Seat of Government or in the event of my inability to be present.

If, for any reason, the Vice-President of the Executive Council is unable to attend, the Senior Member of the Executive Council who is present is hereby authorized to exercise the authority herein vested in the Vice-President.

This Commission supersedes the Commission for the same purpose dated 21st September, 1927.

Now therefore I, Victor George Carrington, the Government Resident of the Territory of Central Australia, do hereby fix the first day of October One thousand nine hundred and thirty as the date on which that Ordinance shall commence.

## ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS.

ORDERED BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL.

I, JOHN LAWRENCE, BARON STONEHAVEN, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby approve of the Administrative Arrangements specified in the Schedule hereto, and do order that, until further Order herein, the matters specified in the First Column of the Schedule, and the Acts of the Commonwealth Parliament specified in the Second Column of the Schedule, shall be administered by the Minister of State for Transport and that the Department of Transport shall be the Department to carry those Acts into effect.
