PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit.
W. J. McKELL
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 15 (a) of the *Customs Act 1901-1947* it is enacted that the Governor-General may by proclamation appoint boarding stations within ports and fix their limits.

And whereas it is desirable to appoint a boarding station within the Ports of Melbourne and Port Phillip, State of Victoria and fix the limits thereof.

Now, therefore, I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby appoint a boarding station within the Ports of Melbourne and Port Phillip, State of Victoria, and fix the limits of such boarding station as follows:—

LIMITS.

All those waters within the Ports of Melbourne and Port Phillip, bounded by imaginary lines as defined hereunder—

Commencing at a point 3.2 cables 335 degrees from the Gellibrand Pile Light and extending 21.5 cables 037 degrees, thence 32.4 cables 180 degrees, thence 11 cables 270 degrees, thence 353 degrees to the point of commencement.

This Proclamation may be cited as Customs Proclamation No. 747. (T. & C. 48/13958.)

Commonwealth of Australia to wit.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by sub-section one of section seventy-six of the *Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1948* it is provided that the Governor-General may proclaim any date to be observed as a holiday in the Commonwealth Service in lieu of any of the days mentioned in the said sub-section:

And whereas it is desired that the holiday to celebrate the anniversary of the birthday of the Sovereign in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine should be

observed in the Commonwealth Service in the Australian Capital Territory, the Northern Territory of Australia, and the State of Tasmania, on Monday, the thirteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, in lieu of Wednesday the fourteenth day of December.

Now therefore I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby appoint Monday, the thirteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, to be observed as a holiday in the Commonwealth Service in the Australian Capital Territory, the Northern Territory of Australia, and the State of Tasmania, in lieu of Wednesday, the fourteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine.
