

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by The Australian Efficiency Decoration Regulations, 1932, The Australian Efficiency Medal Regulations, 1932, The Australian Long Service and Good Conduct Medal (Military) Regulations, 1932, The Australian Meritorious Service Medal Regulations, 1932, the expression "Time of war" is defined as meaning any time between the third day of September in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and such date as is fixed, by proclamation by the Governor-General published in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette*, as the termination for the purposes of those Regulations of the war which commenced on the third day of September in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine.

And whereas it is desired to fix the date of termination of the said war for the purpose of the said Regulations as the twenty-eighth day of April, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-two.

Now therefore I, Sir William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, do hereby fix the twenty-eighth day of April in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-two as the date of termination, for the purposes of the said Regulations, of the war which commenced on the third day of September in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine.

DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND CUSTOMS.

Customs Tariff 1933-1950.

DUTY ON PARTS: PARTS ORDER.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Customs Tariff 1933-1950* and all other enabling powers, I, Neil O'Sullivan, Minister of State for the Commonwealth of Australia, administering the Department of Trade and Customs, hereby direct that 300 "Eaton" 2-speed axle assemblies entered for home consumption on the dates indicated hereunder shall be chargeable with duty under Tariff Item 359 (D) (4) (b) subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) that such "Eaton" 2-speed axle assemblies will be incorporated as original equipment in "Bedford" truck chassis in lieu of an equivalent number of standard axle assemblies already imported in such chassis; and
- (b) that the 300 standard rear axle assemblies imported with "Bedford" truck chassis will be incorporated in a similar number of chassis to be imported from the United Kingdom without such assemblies.
