ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS.

ORDER BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. SLIM Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Common-wealth of Australia.
