- (a) that any reference in any Act (other than the Tariff Board Act 1921-1953), or in any instrument (including regulations and by-laws) made or issued under any Act (other than the Tariff Board Act 1921-1953), to the Department of Trade and Customs shall be read as a reference to the Department of Customs and Excise;
- (b) that any reference in the Tariff Board Act 1921-1953, or in any instrument (including regulations)

- made or issued under that Act, to the Department of Trade and Customs shall be read as a reference to the Department of Trade; and
- (c) that any reference in any Act, or in any instrument (including regulations) made or issued under any Act, to the Department of Commerce and Agriculture shall be read as a reference to the Department of Primary Industry.
