PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit DE L'ISLE Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (2.) of section two of the Papua and New Guinea Act 1963 that sections three, four, five, nine, twelve and thirteen of that Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation:

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (3.) of section two of that Act that sections six and eight of that Act shall come into operation on such dates as are respectively fixed by Proclamation, but that the date fixed in respect of section six shall be a date not carlier than the date fixed under sub-section (2.) of section two of that Act:

And whereas, by Proclamation published in the Gazette on the scenteenth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-three, the eighteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-three, was fixed as the date for the coming into operation of sections three, four, five, nine, twelve and thirteen of that Act: And whereas it is desirable to fix the eighth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-four, as the date on which section vix of that Act shall come into operation:

Now therefore I, William Phillip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby fix the eighth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-four, as the date on which section six of the Papua and New Guinea Act 1963 shall come into operation.

Defence Act 1903-1956. AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1956 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manœuvres, or other naval, military or air forces exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey of use:

And whereas regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reasons of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (2) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

Now therefore I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General aforesaid in and over the Commonwealth of Australia. acting with advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorise such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, managuves or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

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During the period commencing from and including the date on which this authority is signed until and including the thirty first day of December, 1964.
