



War service information

Service records

Boer War

Nominal rolls for most Victorian and NSW Boer War units and some units from other states are held on microfilm in all National Archives research centres, with the exception of the Melbourne research centre.

Attestation forms for about a third of the approximately 15,000 who saw Boer War service (mainly those who saw service in Commonwealth battalions following Federation) are held by the National Archives. Online digital copies of <u>Boer War dossiers</u> are available to view on RecordSearch.

World War I

The National Archives holds the service records for members of the First Australian Imperial Force (1st AIF), Australian Flying Corps, Australian Naval and Military Expeditionary Force, Royal Australian Naval Bridging Train, and the Australian Army Nursing Service. Depot and home records (for those who would have served overseas if the war had not ended, and for those who served within Australia) are also held.

Online digital copies of World War I service records are available to view on RecordSearch.

Permanent Military Forces (1901-40)

Service records and attestation papers for the period 1901–40 are held by the National Archives Melbourne Office. Online digital copies of the <u>attestation papers</u> (series B4747) are available to view on RecordSearch.

World War II

The Archives holds service records for Australians who served during World War II in the Australian Army, the Royal Australian Navy (RAN), and the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF). A number of online digital copies are available to view on RecordSearch.

Campaigns since World War II

Service records for more recent campaigns, including Korea, Malaya and Vietnam are still held by the Department of Defence. Records in the open access period can be requested through the National Archives (see contact details below).

Royal Australian Navy (RAN)

Record of service cards are held for Navy service between 1911 and 1970. Online digital copies of these service cards (series A6769 and A6770) are available to view on RecordSearch.

Purchasing copies of service records

To purchase a copy of a service record, find the item on <u>RecordSearch</u> and then select 'Request copy'. Alternatively, <u>Ask us a question</u> or contact us through our National Reference Service at PO Box 4924, KINGSTON ACT 2604.

<u>Courts-martial files</u> dating from 1901 for each of the services are held in series A471 in the National Archives Canberra Office.

Citations, photographs, nominal and embarkation rolls, and unit diaries

Contact the <u>Australian War Memorial</u> for citations for most recommendations for honours and awards resulting from Australia's participation in all 20th century campaigns. The Memorial also has an extensive photographic collection, maps, films and books, and holds official Commonwealth

records such as nominal and embarkation rolls, and unit diaries, as well as privately donated papers including letters and diaries.
