



Family history sources held in Adelaide

Family history sources held in the Adelaide Office of the National Archives consist mainly of records created by Commonwealth agencies located in South Australia. Most of the records date from Federation in 1901, although some records – naturalisation, post and telegraph, lighthouse and mercantile marine records – also cover the colonial period.

The Adelaide Office also has microfilm copies of selected genealogical research records that are located in other offices of the National Archives.
