Births, deaths and marriages

The registration of births, deaths and marriages in Australia was initially the responsibility of the colonies and later, the states and territories. Inquiries about births, deaths and marriages within Australia should, in most cases, be directed to the registrar in the state or territory in which the event took place. The list that follows indicates where registers for the Australian states and territories are held.

Contact the institutions of interest or visit their website to get details of services offered and the charges that apply for the purchase of certificates.

Australian Capital Territory

Registrations for the Australian Capital Territory before 1930 are held by the New South Wales registry.

New South Wales

NSW Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages GPO Box 30 Sydney NSW 2001

Holds registrations for Australian Capital Territory before 1930. Also holds incomplete information about deaths on war service of New South Wales enlistments to the Boer War (1899–1901).

Northern Territory

Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages GPO Box 3021 Darwin NT 0801

Holds information about deaths on war service for Northern Territory enlistments to World War II (1939–45).

Queensland

Births, Deaths and Marriages PO Box 15188 City East QLD 4002

Holds information about deaths on war service for Queensland enlistments to World War I (1914–18) and World War II (1939–45).

South Australia

Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Office GPO Box 1351 Adelaide SA 5001

Holds information about deaths on war service for South Australian enlistments to World War I (1914–18) and World War II (1939–45).

Tasmania

Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages GPO Box 198 Hobart TAS 7001

Holds information about deaths on war service for Tasmanian enlistments to World War I (1914–18), World War II (1939–45) and the Korean War (1950–53).

Registrations for the period before 1900 are held by the Archives Office of Tasmania.

Australian citizens overseas

Registrations for Australian citizens lodged overseas at Australian Embassies, High Commissions, Consulates-General, Consulates, or other Australian or United Kingdom missions are controlled by the Department of Home Affairs. These include the registration of children born overseas to Australian citizens.

Records of births and marriages which took place before a person migrated to Australia are not maintained by the Australian Government. Where the person has been naturalised such details will usually be found on the application for naturalisation.
